

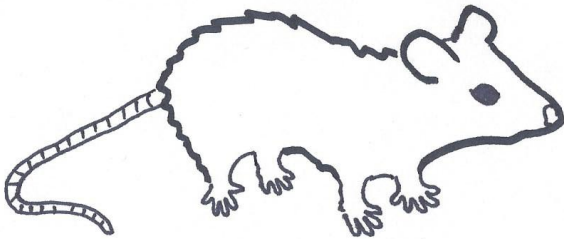

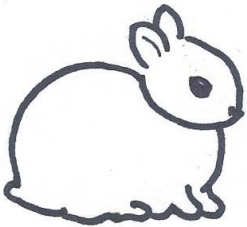

Baby elk are born to run! Elk can stand and walk soon after birth.



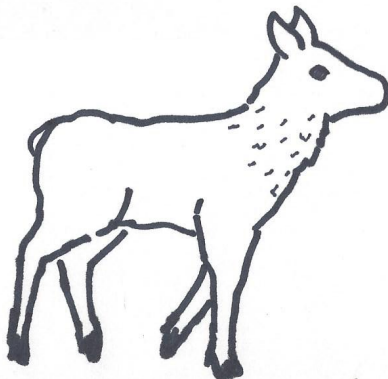
Opossums use their paws and tail to hold tight to their mother like a backpack.

Many frogs are born as tadpoles. Tadpoles have tails to help them swim in ponds and puddles.

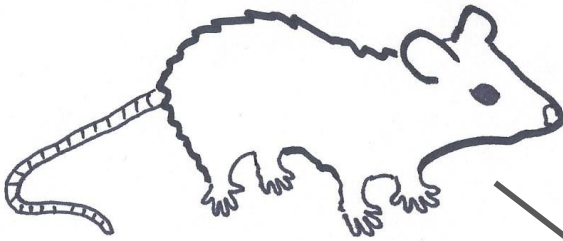
